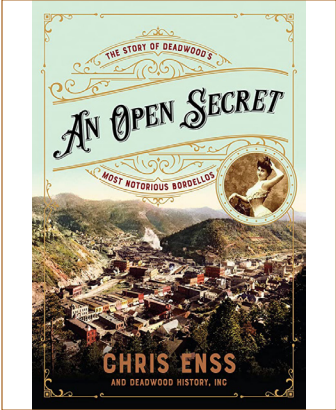


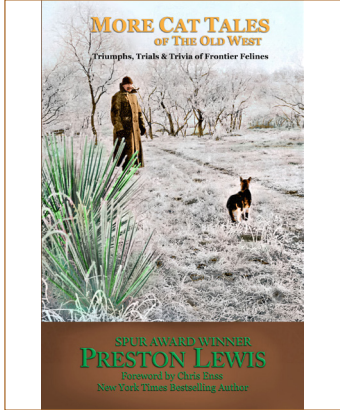


Meet the Authors at HPWHC This Month



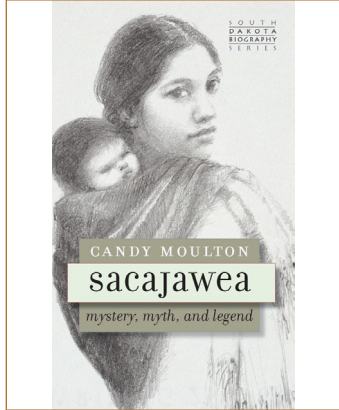
Sunday June 18th 2:00PM
Chris Enss - *An Open Secret*

The official launch of award-winning and NY Times bestselling author Chris Enss' latest book, *An Open Secret*, focuses on infamous cat houses like the Beige Door, those individuals who managed the businesses, their employees, their well-known clientele, the various crimes committed at the locations, and their ultimate demise. *An Open Secret: The Story of Deadwood's Most Notorious Bordellos* focuses on the brothels and the women who worked in the oldest profession in the ferocious town. Preston Lewis - *More Cat Tales*

In *More Cat Tales of the Old West: Triumphs, Trials & Trivia of Frontier Felines*, two-time Spur Award recipient Preston Lewis pulls together another amusing and eclectic collection of articles from western newspaper reports on frontier cats. In the sequel to his award-winning *Cat Tales of the Old West: Poems, Puns & Perspectives on Frontier Felines*, Lewis provides another engaging look at frontier felines from the perspective of pioneering times. Preston will be on hand with his books for an autograph session following his presentation in the theater.

Candy Moulton - *Sacajawea*

In this new biography of Sacajawea, Candy Moulton reads between the lines of the journals and letters written by members of the Corps of Discovery to provide a fascinating portrait of the Shoshone woman who made possible the success of Lewis and Clark's venture to explore the furthest reaches of the 1803 Louisiana Purchase. The author takes Sacajawea's story beyond the triumphant return of the Corps to St. Louis in 1806, following the lives of her son Jean-Baptiste (b. 1805) and daughter Lizette (b. 1812) and her own mysterious death.
